

Jack Lucas Antique Tractor and Engine Show

The Tractor & Engine Show is named in memory of Jack Lucas who moved from Taylor County to Belington. Jack had a number of antique tractors and is responsible for getting the show started. The Jack Lucas Antique Tractor & Engine Show has become a regular part of the annual Barbour County Fair. This year will be the eighth year for the show. The 2017 show will be held Saturday, September 2, but exhibitors are welcome to bring their entries and display them all week.

The 2017 show will include four classes. The classes will be: Antique Tractors, Modified Tractors, Antique Engines, and Modified Engines. Each exhibitor will be granted a pass to the fair. There will be no entry fee for entering the show. Magnetic placards will be given to all exhibitors.

The 2017 Barbour County Fair Queen will select her choice of engine and her choice of tractor in each class. Following the Queen's selection, trophies, as well as a \$25.00, prize will be presented.

Each exhibitor of an engine and tractor will select their choice of engine and tractor in each class. The choices will be tallied. Trophies will be presented to the exhibitors who receive the largest number of tallies for each engine and tractor in each class. There will also be a \$50.00 prize given to the exhibitor who travels the farthest distance. To be eligible for trophies and monetary prizes, engines and tractors must be on exhibit Saturday, September 2. A parade of tractors will be held on Saturday after the judging.
